



## Welcome to our first newsletter for 2021, we hope you have been well during this time.

We are pleased to recognise all the hard work by our staff members and contractors on-site. As we enter a new phase in social distancing measures, we are excited to share our construction progress and upcoming plans with you for West Hendon.

### CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Two new blocks are currently under construction, with the smaller block of 43 new homes due to be completed later this year and the taller block, with 143 new homes, due to be completed next year. The taller block will soon rise from the ground as its extensive ground works and foundations are now complete. The series of major highway improvement works to West Hendon Broadway are likely to start next year, and BMLLP are working with Barnet Council on how best to implement these so they cause the least disruption possible – the completion of these works will see both the road and pavement up and down the Broadway be renewed. Also due to start later this year will be the demolition of the 232 flats in Marsh Drive, and in readiness for this, hoarding to this area will commence soon.



### WEST HENDON COMMUNITY TRUST FUND

MTVH have been working hard to re-establish the West Hendon Community Trust Fund. The board has met informally and held their first formal meeting on Monday 19th April. MTVH provide administrative support for this resident led Trust. The board are currently working on defining their funding priorities which they will publicise, as well as details on how residents and local community groups can apply for funding. ### WEST HENDON COMMUNITY HUB – RESIDENT FEEDBACK

On Wednesday 24th February Natalie Beccles, MTVH Resident Voice Coordinator, spoke to some residents who have been using the foodbank at the Hub to understand what you would like to see happen at the Hub and why. The three questions asked were: 1) What would you like to see at the Hub once lockdown is lifted? 2) Why do you want to see it? 3) What difference do you think it will make to the community? Some of the main points they raised were:

- **Activities for children** – arts & crafts, activities, boxing, children's trips.
- **Activities for adults** – mum baby groups, exercise classes, reading book club, IT training, Job advice, family activities, manicure, and pedicure sessions.
- **Older people** – chair-based exercises and bingo.

The main differences you want to see in the community include: Reducing anti-social behaviour; Improving people's mental health; Getting people into work and off benefits; Helping older people that are isolated; Bringing people in the estate together (more generally).

#### What will happen next?

Andre Peters, Regional Community Coordinator has taken your points on board and is currently working on an online West Hendon Community Hub timetable to include a list of programmes for residents to engage in until we are able to use the hub for face-to-face services. Andre will be taking this feedback on board to develop future Hub provisions.

### DID YOU KNOW?

- The smaller block under construction will need 160,000 bricks to create its external façade, whilst the larger one will need 500,000.
- There is over 6000 tonnes of steel reinforcement used within the concrete to support the construction of all new buildings in Phase 4.

### COMMUNITY HUB FEASIBILITY WORK

Barnet Council (LLB) and MTVH are working together to expand the current Community Hub and create a more flexible community space. We want to make sure that the Hub reflects the aspirations and feedback of West Hendon residents and has better space and facilities. To do this LBB and MTVH are currently commissioning an independent consultant who will work with residents to develop a suitable model and prepare a business case. Responses to the tender will be assessed in April and a presentation made to the West Hendon Partnership Board. Further updates will be provided in future newsletters.

## EON'S OPEN SESSIONS WITH MTVH RESIDENTS

In our previous newsletter, we informed you about an open session with Eon to discuss any issues you had or ask questions. This session took place on **Wednesday 3rd February**. Some of the key issues you raised were:
