WEST HENDON CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Phase 4 Key Activities

- Deep drainage works at Shearwater Drive commenced in September and continue as planned.
- External areas opening up, working towards the link up of Phase 2 and Phase 4.

Block K2

- All homes complete and around 100 properties are now occupied with the remainder ongoing.
- External areas continue to be installed and opened up, with full completions for Spring 2023.

Block J4

- · Scaffold removal complete.
- External areas ongoing along with internal commissioning.
- First completions February 2023.

J5 Block

- External brickworks ongoing.
- · Internal first fix ongoing.

J Basements

· Works ongoing to slabs and drainage and cores 90%.

Phase 5&6

- · All planned demolition works completed.
- Ongoing works to relocate substation to be completed in January, followed by remaining demolition to be completed by February 2023.
- Sewer diversion and upgrading to commence December /early New Year.

We offer one-to-one sessions with our peer supporters, specially trained people from your community who have lived experience of the challenges you face, who can help you set personal goals to improve your heart health and support you while you make those changes.

We will also offer some online support groups for those of you who can't join us in person


